

Outreach - School links are going international!

We are in the very early stages of an exciting project here in school. We hope to form a close link with a similar school to ours in Pakistan. This will open up opportunities for our pupils to learn about children who live in another country and to celebrate our similarities and differences.

The school is 'The Rising Sun Institute' (RSI) and is in Lahore. It is now the largest Institute in Pakistan providing education, speech therapy, physio, hydro & sensory integration therapy, vocational training, physiotherapy and speech therapy leading to rehabilitation into the community for more than 500 children with intellectual impairment, cerebral palsy and autism.

We are very excited about this new experience and look forward to sharing our activities with you in future newsletters.

We enjoyed a visit from "Flash, Bang Science" in February which tied in with our Creative Curriculum Theme: Living in a Material World.



All the students got to wear proper white coats and safety goggles and so we all felt like real Scientists.






